

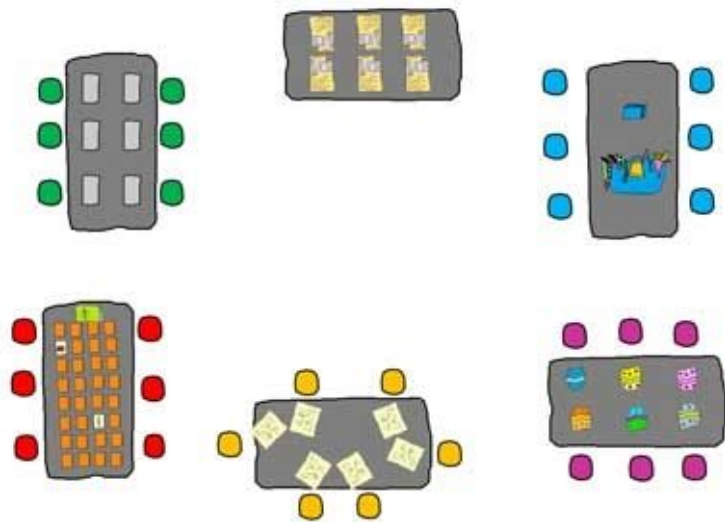
WORLD LANGUAGE CENTERS FOR ALL LANGUAGES AND LEVELS

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What are centers?

- Learning Centers or Learning Stations
- Students work on different individual, partner, or group activities
- All activities happening simultaneously



Why Centers?

- Students grouped according to their needs
- Differentiate for varying proficiency levels in the same class
- Promote independence
- Students become more responsible
- Learn through self-discovery
- Take risks without fear of failure
- Time for teachers to pull students one-on-one or in small groups

Skill Centers

- Organized around language skills
- Writing, speaking, reading, and listening
- Can include activities specific to a unit, or general activities to practice skill
